#### SAINT JOSEPH ~ MAN OF FAITH

On Sunday, March 19<sup>th</sup> our school will celebrate the feast day of our school's patron, St Joseph husband of Mary. We have moved the day of celebration for this special man to Tuesday, March 21<sup>st</sup>. This is a day we plan carefully as we believe, like St Mary MacKillop who named her schools after this special saint that St Joseph is a man worthy of celebrating.

"I will not be a complainer today. Instead, I will be a patient listener to those who are truly troubled. Amen"

This anonymous quote may be the best way to sum up St Joseph's outlook on his life and responsibilities towards those in his care. Having very few references in the Gospels, not one of them records a single word he spoke.

Joseph totally lived by faith – not because of his words but because of his actions. He listened in silence...he accepted his obligations readily...he persevered in his supporting role with unrelenting commitment...he nurtured and loved unconditionally...he carried out his vocation with complete loyalty...he knew difficulty, danger, hard work and fatigue.

Given what the world has gone through over the past few years you can understand people asking the question, "Where is God when pandemics, natural disasters strike or wars and other tragedies?" We probably all ask this question when things go wrong in our lives. As we celebrate the feast of our patron, St Joseph I am sure there were times when he also wondered about the things that were happening in his life. Instead of bemoaning and wondering, "Why me?" he trusted in God and knew he would be able to get through the difficult times.

Please join us on Tuesday, March 21<sup>st</sup> at 9:30 for our school Mass led by Years 7, 8 & 9 in the school Auditorium. March 21<sup>st</sup> is also Harmony Day, a day when we recognise and celebrate our diversity of cultures, disabilities, and the way we do things. #### CONGRATULATIONS!

#### MANNUM BUS SERVICE

As of this week, St Joesph's School will run a bus to and from Mannum daily to pick up and drop off students. This service is possible due to Catholic Education South Australia lobbying to receive a state government grant to support children's access to bus services in rural and regional areas to take them to a Catholic School. This funding doesn't cover all expenses but does enable our families from Mannum to access the bus at a lower cost. #### MID-TERM ENROLMENTS

In 2023, St. Joseph's School will continue to offer mid-year enrolments. If your child turns **5 before 31 October 2023**, they can start school at St. Joseph's in **Term 3**, **2023**, **and the school fees are free**. Children starting in Reception mid-year will have a minimum of 6 terms in Reception. Enrolments are also open for the beginning of 2024. Please contact the school administration to register your interest and book a Principal's tour. Children who turn **5 on or before 30 April can begin school in Term 1 of 2024**. Please let friends and family know that enrolments are open for Mid Year 2023 and the beginning of 2024.

# From the Classroom - Year Two



During the first half of Term One, the Year Two students have engaged in identifying and describing the feelings of others, when they feel 'included' as well as 'excluded' from a variety of situations. We acknowledged that it is important to welcome all people and explored ways in which we can be inclusive of everyone in our class and school community.

In Numeracy, we have been busy learning about being 'Mathematicians', developing and practising efficient counting strategies, place value and ordering and representing numbers to 1000. We are also now exploring calendars, months and dates within a year.

As part of our Inquiry learning, the Year Two children have investigated how technology has changed over time and effected how people live. They conducted interviews to gather information about the ways in which people they know used to work, travel and communicate in the past. We are now moving onto exploring our Earth and Space Science topic about 'The Solar System.' Throughout the term, the students have also participated in weekly 'Footsteps' dance lessons with great enthusiasm and creativity. We are all looking forward to continuing this program for the remainder of Term One.

#### **PROCEDURES FOR ORDERING UNIFORMS**

We have been working with Vinnies to help improve the process for our families to either book a uniform fitting order or place an order for the new uniform. This can now be done via scanning QR codes using a mobile device such as your mobile phone.

#### **Book a Fitting**

A reminder from Vinnies - 'Please book any future appointments online or they can call the store direct and we can book a fitting for the same day if needed, that way we won't get double booked and the parents won't be disappointed if asked to wait or come back at a later time.'
