NAIDOC WEEK 2023 'For Our Elders'

We acknowledge that our school is on the traditional country of the Ngarrindjeri people. We recognise and respect their cultural heritage, beliefs, and relationships with the land. We acknowledge that they are of continuing importance to the Ngarrindjeri people living today.

Every year in the first week of July we celebrate **NAIDOC** Week. NAIDOC stands for **N**ational **A**borigines and **I**slanders **D**ay **O**bservance **C**ommittee. Its origins can be traced to the emergence of Aboriginal groups in the 1920's which sought to increase awareness in the wider community of the status and treatment of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Australians.

This years theme is **For Our Elders**, recognising how across every generation, Elders have played and continue to play, an important role and hold a prominent place in our communities and families.

They have guided generations and paved the way for them to take the paths they can take today. Guidance, not only through generations of advocacy and activism, but in everyday life and how to place themselves in the world. First Nations People draw strength from their knowledge and experience, in everything from land management, cultural knowledge to justice and human rights. Across multiple sectors like health, education, the arts, politics, and everything in between, they have set the many courses they follow.

This year we will be called to vote in a referendum where Australians will be asked whether to alter the Constitution to recognise the First Peoples of Australia by establishing an Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Voice. At Mass a few weeks ago Fr John Vildzius shared with us how much Jesus loved and worked for all people. Below are some of the thoughts Fr John shared with us.

"Today we hear how Jesus felt sorry for the people because they were harassed and dejected. As always, Jesus took action. He didn't just make promises...he did what was needed. You and I, as people who bear his name, are also called to love, care and feel deeply for people. In this spirit you and I are called to consider deeply the issue of the Voice for our Indigenous people. When it comes to the referendum, we are called to vote in the spirit of Jesus...given what we know about the values and principles of Jesus, how in conscience do we think Jesus would want us to vote? Have we prayed about this? It's not too late."

On Monday, July 3rd a group of our Indigenous students and teachers will meet on the East side of the bridge at 9:10am to take part in the annual NAIDOC Week Bridge Walk. We will walk to the Council offices where the presentations for the NAIDOC awards will be presented. Please see the flyer below for other NAIDOC week activities.



Students have also been exploring using a character voice to introduce a finger puppet animal.




In **Music** the students have been singing the songs BINGO and Old Mac Donald as they played percussion instruments to highlight the beat and rhythm of the songs.

Knockout Netball









Starting School This July?

Like all Catholic schools across South Australia, St Joseph's School will continue to offer free mid-year Reception enrolment intake for students who turn <u>five on or before October 31</u>, 2023, to reduce the financial burden on families. Please see the common questions below about children being ready to start school.

When can my child start school?

St Joseph's School offers two intakes per year for children starting Reception.

Term 1 enrolment - for children who turn five years on or before April 30.

Term 3 enrolment (Mid-Year intake) – for children who turn five years on or before October 31.

Why a Mid-Year intake?

A large body of research shows the benefit of high-quality early learning and care experiences for children in their first 1,000 days of life and the years before school.

Students who start in Term 3 are likely to spend 18 months in Reception before progressing to Year 1. Reception students who join a 2023 mid-year intake at a Catholic school will get free tuition in Terms 3 and 4.

The free intake includes tuition fees and compulsory charges. It will exclude uniforms and extra-curricular costs.

Please call the administration office, 85342000, to make an appointment with the Principal to discuss enrolment and mid-term intake or tour the school.

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Ordering School Uniforms

It is pleasing to see over 90% of the students in their correct school uniform. If you need a to order a uniform you can contact Vinnes.

Book a Fitting

A rerminder from Vinnies - 'Please book any future appointments online, or call the store direct and we can book a fitting for the same day if needed. That way we won't get double booked and the parents won't be disappointed if asked to wait or come back at a later time.'


Cheaper Child Care for most families

From 10 July 2023, changes are coming to the Australian Government's Child Care Subsidy (CCS) that could make care cheaper for most families!



What you need to know:

- The maximum amount of CCS is increasing from 85% to 90%. Families earning up to \$80,000 will get the new maximum percentage of 90%.
- Families earning over \$80,000 may get a subsidy starting from 90%.
 This will go down by 1% for each \$5,000 of income they earn above \$80,000. The CCS percentage they are entitled to depends on their family's income.
- The income limit for CCS is increasing to \$530,000.



Families with more than one child aged 5 or under

Families earning below \$362,408 with more than one child aged 5 or under in care can get a higher rate of CCS for one or more of their children.

What do families need to do?

In most cases, families don't need to do anything to get the increased rate. If they get CCS, the Government will apply the changes to their CCS automatically from 10 July 2023.

Child Care Subsidy activity test changes for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children

From 10 July 2023, there are changes to Child Care Subsidy for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children. The changes mean they can get at least 36 hours of subsidy per fortnight, regardless of their family's income or activity level. Families may get more than 36 hours of subsidy per fortnight based on their circumstances and the amount of recognised activity they do.

Changes to the CCS hourly rate cap for OSHC

The hourly cap rate will increase from \$11.15 to \$12.02 (for schoolaged children)

This means that eligible families can claim CCS up to a maximum of \$12.02 per hour for OSHC for school aged children.

The hourly rate caps are adjusted annually based on the Consumer Price Index (CPI).

Additional Child Care Subsidy

If families get Additional Child Care Subsidy (ACCS) their rates will stay the same.

From 10 July 2023, the low income limit for ACCS Transition to Work (TTW) will increase to \$80,000. Families will still need to meet other ACCS TTW eligibility requirements.

How do I claim Child Care Subsidy?

- 1. Apply for CCS through Centrelink via your MyGov Portal.
- 2. Update your child's CRN with Camp Australia.
- 3. Confirm your enrolment with Centrelink.
