# From the Classroom - Reception



Reception learners embarked on a journey of discovery to learn about St. Mary of the Cross MacKillop. Through Godly Play, they explored her life as a pioneering educator and advocate for social justice. They expressed their understanding and admiration through songs, creative drawings and crafts that celebrate her legacy as Australia's first saint and her dedication to serving others. These multisensory experiences inspired empathy and fostered an appreciation for the values she embodied, encouraging young learners to reflect on the importance of compassion, kindness, and making a positive impact in their own lives.

In English, the students have started comparing informative texts to narratives. They are also learning about the practical application of Venn diagrams to compare various elements. As part of their phonics development, the students have been learning to blend and use digraphs, including the 'ar,' 'or,' and 'ay' sounds. Learning to blend and use digraphs is an essential part of phonics development and will enable the students to improve their reading and writing skills. With these tools and knowledge, they are well on their way to becoming successful readers and writers!

In Science, the students have begun learning about living and non-living things. The students have explored living things in our school garden and have started growing bean sprouts in the classroom. With enriched conversations through group work, guided conversations and hands on learning, students will work towards understanding features of living and non-living things.

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## Book Week 2023 - Save the Dates!



Book Week celebrations are in Week 5. This year's theme is "Read, Grow, Inspire," and we are planning various activities to celebrate the joy of reading.

The annual Book Week dress-up parade will be held on Friday morning, August 25th, at 9:00 am. Students are encouraged to dress up as a book character or in a way that is related to the theme. We look forward to seeing the creativity of the costumes at the parade!

We will also hold a **Grandparents Day on Wednesday morning**, **August 23rd**, **at 9:00 am**, starting in the Performing Arts Centre. This is a great opportunity for grandparents to come and visit their family members and learn more about what they are learning in school. More information and registration details will be sent out via Seesaw soon.

Finally, the school library will display books and activities related to the Book Week theme, and we will have a visiting author speaking to the students that week. Students are encouraged to visit the library and check out some new books. We hope that you will join us in celebrating Book Week! 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# Free NBN for eligible Families



To boost education opportunities and narrow the digital divide, the Australian Government is working with NBN Co to provide up to 30,000 families currently with no internet at home free NBN for 12 months.

To be eligible, families with school age children will be nominated by participating schools, education authorities and charities/community organisations. These organisations will identify and provide information directly to families within their respective systems about the initiative.

The first families were connected during Term One in 2023. The one-year of free service begins from the day the service is activated for each family.

The eligible families must:-

- Not have an active nbn network internet service at home. Having a mobile service does not affect eligibility.
- Live in a premises that can access the nbn network

• Have a child living at home that is enrolled in an Australian school in 2023.

This program is only open for nomination until 30<sup>th</sup> September 2023.



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

# **LLL Parent and Caregiver Survey**

(Available from 24 July to 25 August 2023)

### **Administering the Survey**

Before parents and caregivers respond to the survey we advise that the following information be relayed:

- The survey takes between three and five minutes.
- Explain that this survey is to find out about the performance of THIS school.
- Stress the importance of the survey as an opportunity for parents and caregivers to tell the school staff how things are going for them and their children.
- Let the parents and caregivers know that the school values their feedback and will try to respond to the information that they provide.
- Explain that the feedback does NOT include the data of individuals; rather, feedback involves graphs based on feedback from all parents and caregivers. To ensure anonymity, aggregated scores are not provided for groups of less than four parents or caregivers.
- Let parents and caregivers know that it is their impressions that you are seeking. There are no right or wrong answers
- For parents and caregivers with more than one child at the school, ask them to respond based on the experience of their oldest child at the school.
- Explain that the response format requires parents and caregivers to consider the school's performance for
  each statement on a scale from 1 to 6 (with 1 being the lowest or worst score and 6 being the highest or
  best score).

A sample letter to parents is provided on the following page. This letter includes instructions to participants and can be modified as required.

Advertising the survey and reminding parents and carers to complete it will be important to ensure that the response rate is maximised. This is the school's responsibility. We suggest that the school consider using a range of media, including newsletters and social media. We recommend that reminders (at least two) are sent to participants during and at the end of the administration period.



Dear Parents and Caregivers,

You are invited to participate in a short (3 to 5 minute) survey about your school's performance. Similar surveys will be administered to staff and students to enable us to capture a community snapshot.

All responses are confidential and will be used for school improvement purposes.

Completion of the survey is on a voluntary basis.

#### Your confidentiality

To protect your confidentiality all surveys are anonymous. All answers go directly to National School Improvement Partnerships, where the results are analysed for your school. Answers from individual surveys will NOT be reported back to the school. National School Improvement Partnerships staff are bound by a Code of Ethics and follow strict professional conduct. To protect your anonymity, we do not report scores for groups of less than four parents or caregivers.

#### Use of the data

National School Improvement Partnerships will report the results to the school in an aggregated format. To enable drill-down reporting, the information provided to the school will contain data based on background information. This anonymous data will be provided to CESA for reporting and consideration of support for schools.

#### How to complete the survey

- For each statement, you are asked to rate how well you think the school is performing by selecting one of six responses.

  The responses are numbered 1 to 6, with number 1 being the lowest or worst rating and number 6 being the highest or best rating.
- If you have more than one child at the school, and your perceptions differ for each child, please respond with respect to your perceptions related to the oldest child enrolled at the school.
- There are no 'right' or 'wrong' answers. Your opinion is what is wanted.
- Please answer all questions.
- Some statements may be fairly similar to other statements. Don't worry about this. Simply give your opinion about all statements.
