I want to extend my appreciation to all the parents and guardians who contributed to the 2024 class preparation survey. The survey is now closed, and we are carefully reviewing your responses to guide our decisions in the coming weeks. Our commitment remains focused on ensuring small class sizes, adding classroom support staff, and offering specialised small-group support in areas like literacy and numeracy and occupational therapy—all aimed at creating an environment where every student and teacher can thrive. Additionally, teacher class allocation will be matching their unique expertise and skills with the needs of their students. Recently, our students also submitted their friendship preferences for next year, and I anticipate sending out draft class lists with the confirmed staffing details in the next week. Parents and guardians will be invited to review this draft and reach out to me directly via email if there are considerations to discuss. This collaborative process is aimed at both your insights and the professional judgment of our dedicated staff.

Looking Ahead to 2025!

This year, our curriculum focus on numeracy has produced impressive growth in student achievement, and we plan to maintain this focus in 2025. Teachers will have increased access to experts in both numeracy and literacy as we work on advancing students' foundational skills in reading, writing, spelling, grammar, and punctuation. The MultiLit resources and reading interventions for Reception through Year 9 will also expand, providing further support for early literacy.

As your principal, I am committed to listening to the needs of our community, addressing areas of improvement, and continually

enhancing our learning environment. I recognise that every year has a period of change that can bring uncertainty, but please know that our team at St. Joseph's is dedicated to providing a supportive and enriching experience for you and your children. It is a privilege and a responsibility that we all hold in the highest regard.

To wrap up the year, we have planned several class presentations, providing wonderful opportunities for the school community to come together and celebrate our students' achievements. We invite you to bring friends along and join in these events, which promise something for everyone.

Thank you for your continued support and partnership. It won't be long before we are celebrating our 100th Birthday in Primary Education in February next year. Together, lets continue to aim building a nurturing and enriching environment for all our students and families here at St. Joseph's.

THE SIGN OF THE CROSS

In this Newsletter I would like to share an article written by Deacon Arturo Jimenea from our parish about the Sign of the Cross.

It is very common and a very notable practice of Christians all over the world to make the Sign of the Cross on themselves. By this very action are Christians recognised and become known as such.

Roman Catholics usually make the Sign of the Cross with the right hand sequentially touching the forehead, then the centre of the chest (heart), then on to the left shoulder and ending with the right shoulder, while uttering with the words, "In the name of the Father" (hand on forehead), "and of the Son" (hand on the chest), "and of the Holy Spirit" (hand touching consecutively the left and right shoulders).

To us, the act of signing ourselves with the Cross is not just a pious gesture but a prayer: an acknowledgment and proclamation of what we believe in – one God in the Holy Trinity; and at the same time, recognising that it is through his suffering and death on the cross that Christ's mission for our salvation was accomplished.

Many a time when we settle down to pray, we ordinarily begin and end with the Sign of he Cross and then on to our set prayers. For instance, in the Mass, the priest begins and concludes the celebration with the Sign of the Cross.

Now, it is also our custom that whenever we enter a church, we dip our fingers into the stoup (bowl) and wet our fingers with holy water and then sign ourselves with the Cross. In the action of doing this, we ask the Lord to bless us, even as we get to be reminded of our baptism "in the name of the father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit".

The Sign of the Cross is a powerful statement of our faith, so powerful a prayer in fact, that we are able to confidently employ it to ask for God's help and protection especially when we are beset by times of trial and temptation.

We should not be afraid or embarrassed to publicly sign ourselves with the Cross anywhere and whenever the occasion arises. This is our faith, and we should be proud to witness it and proclaim it.

Remembrance Day



Monday, November 11 is Remembrance Day. Each year on the 11th hour of this day we stop and join with other nations to pay respect and remember all those who were injured or lost their lives in wars around the world since World War 1.

To comemorate this day the Middle Years students led us in a Prayer of remembrance. We came together as a whole school in the Auditorium at 10:45 which allowed for the Last Post and a minute's silence at 11am. Our Middle Years students led us in prayer for these very brave people who gave their lives for us to be free and we also prayed that the leaders in the world now will work together to support peace in our world. A number of students made and wore poppies or rosemary as a sign of remembrance.

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
Boosting our Community Spirit in the Middle Years




